Participation is strictly voluntary -- you may refuse participation or end the interview at any time. In addition, please note that your decision whether to participate will have no effect on any score or grade you receive in courses taught by Professor Plous.

All responses will be held in strict confidence, and in no case will data from individual participants be identified. When reporting the results, all numeric and categorical data will be pooled and published in aggregate form only. To ensure the confidentiality of responses, the interview also uses a "secure" connection of the kind typically used for credit card transactions.

Many individuals find participation in this study interesting and informative, and the results will help social scientists understand people's attitude towards race relations and discrimination.
